The former Soviet nuclear testing site at Semipalatinsk in Kazakhstan was formally closed by President Nursultan Nazarbayev on August 29, 1991. Two years prior, the Nevada-Semipalatinsk Public Anti-Nuclear Movement was founded to help stop nuclear testing in Central Asia, the United States, and globally. This event will bring together experts and officials from both countries to discuss this historic moment, twenty years later, under auspices of the Atomic Testing Museum in Las Vegas and the Karaganda Ecological Museum in Kazakhstan
